

Sponsor the 2016 Fly Fishing Film Festival!

The R4F Fly Fishing Film Festival will be back again in River Falls in 2016! What started as a fun experiment for area fly fishing enthusiasts in 2014 has evolved into an exciting event for the community and a significant fundraiser for the KRLT. With participation (and attendees) from multiple states, *last year's event generated over \$12,000 for the KRLT*! The upcoming 2016 R4F is scheduled for Friday, March 11th at the UWRF University Center. Doors will open at 5:00 pm with films beginning at 7:00 pm.

In addition to raising funds for the KRLT, the R4F Fly Fishing Film Festival attracts a broader audience than just those who fish, and supports River Falls as a regional center for western Wisconsin river conservation. The genre of "fly fishing" films has grown steadily over the past decade. Using fly fishing as the metaphor, the films address themes like conservation, culture, family, travel and the joy of nature/fishing in a manner that is entertaining for everyone, not just those who fly fish.

The evening's festivities include multiple vendors, artists demonstrating their crafts, and the opportunity to win dozens of items. The R4F Fly Fishing Film Festival will present 6-7 films, each with a running time of 10-30 minutes. Trailers for this year's event are available online at www.flyfilmtour.com/watch-trailers/.

River Falls Hydroelectric Facilities Update

The City of River Falls filed an application with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) last July to extend the current hydroelectric license for five years to allow time to conduct a Kinnickinnic River corridor planning process. The City's request was denied by FERC on December 9, 2015. This rejection upholds an August 31, 2016 deadline by which the City must decide whether to relicense or decommission the facilities. On January 8, 2016, the City filed a request for rehearing. The detailed documents can be reviewed on the City's website at https://example.city.com/hydroelectric-Relicensing.

The KRLT has continued to participate as a stakeholder in the process. We were one of many groups and individuals to submit a <u>letter of support</u> for the City's license extension request. Following the recent FERC denial of the City's request, the KRLT submitted a <u>letter to the Mayor and City Council</u> expressing concern about the time constraints imposed by the current deadline and encouraging the Council to initiate an alternatives analysis.

"The Dam Decision", a documentary created by UWRF student Sydney Howell, premiered December 7, 2015 at The Falls Theatre of River Falls to a standing room only crowd. This short film presents both sides of the current community conversation concerning dam relicensing or river restoration on the Kinnickinnic River.
